## Phases of our school

We have a 26 place nursery morning and afternoon. We also offer 30 hours of childcare for working parents. Reception follows the Development Matters document leading to the Early Learning Goal at the end of Reception. Learning is play based in a stimulating space Key Stage one and two

We teach the full national curriculum through a thematic approach using local links as a starting point. We immerse children in topics that ignite their interests, with a book as a starting point, planning rich practical activities for learning that bridge meaningful links across subjects - changing their understanding of concepts long term so that it is committed to memory and built upon again within their next learning stage in school.

#### Learning experiences

Alongside prefects, school eco teams, headstarters and computer techies — our children learn democracy and how to lead and support others throughout school.
