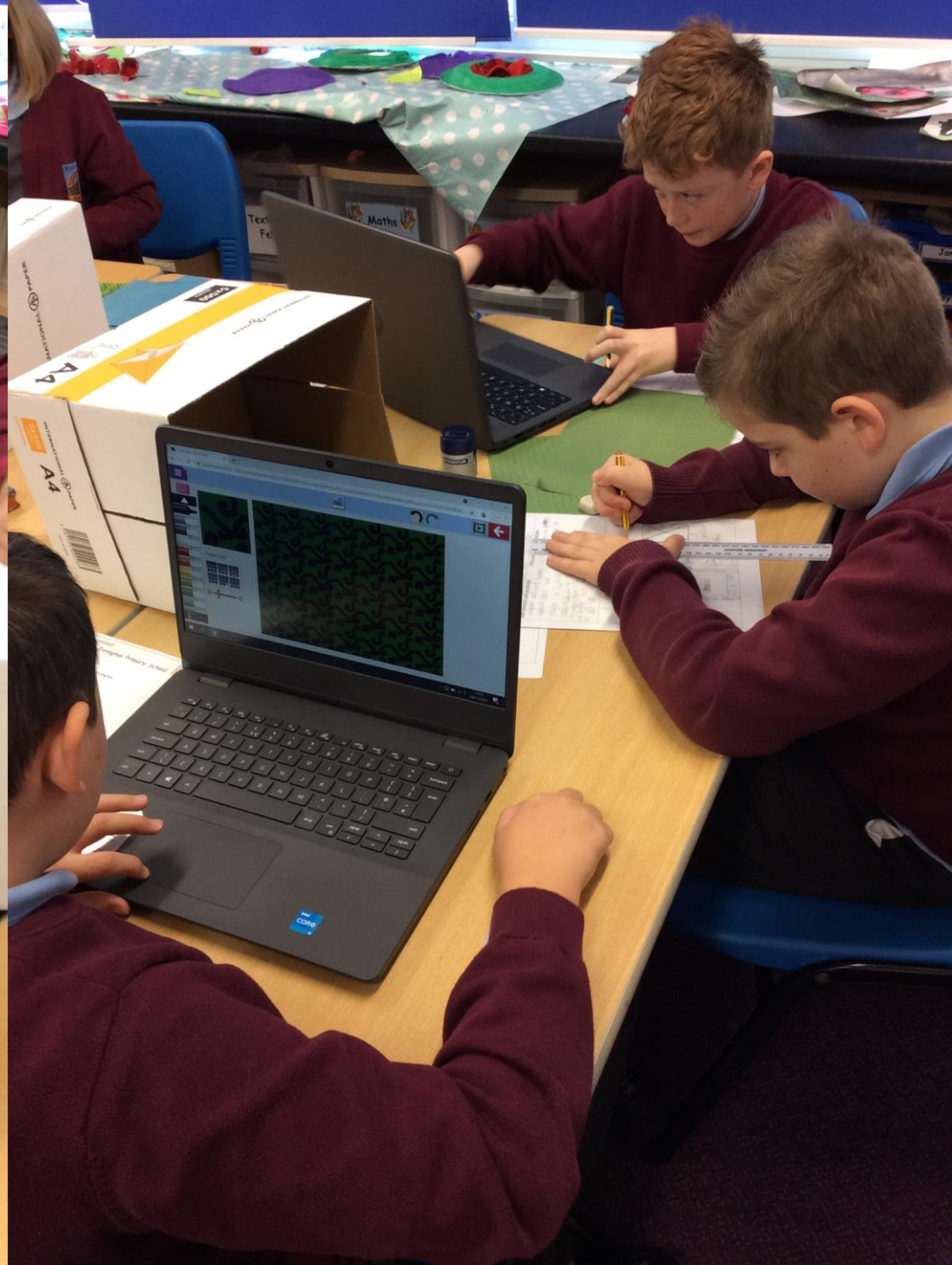
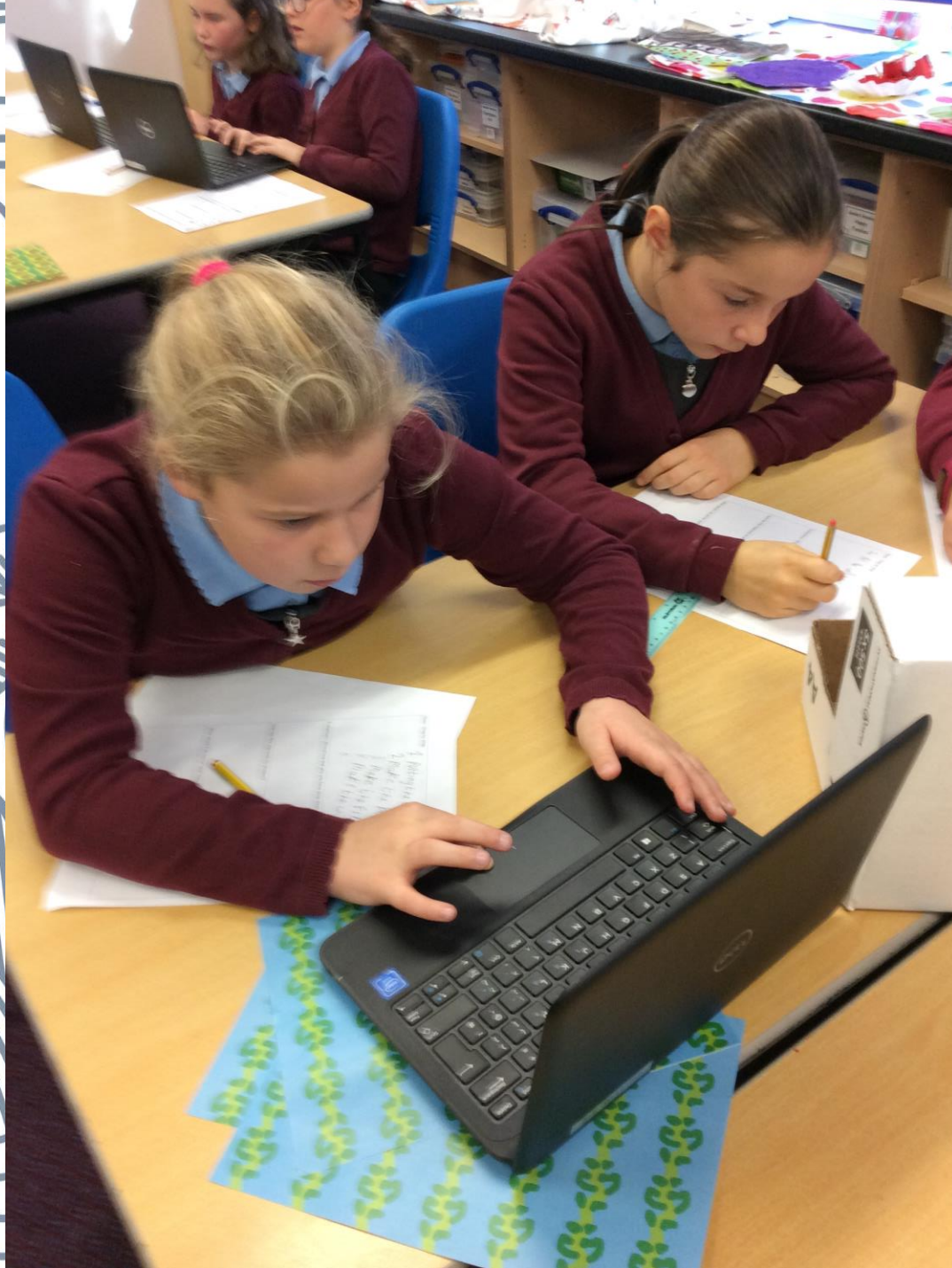

It will need to: have an electric light and look very fancy.

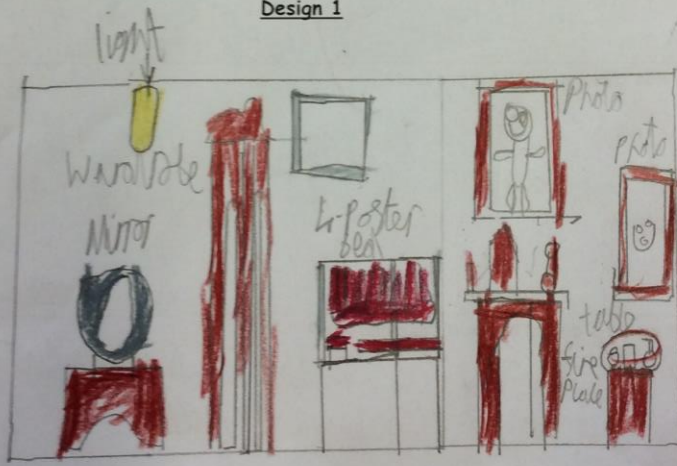
What materials I will use and why:

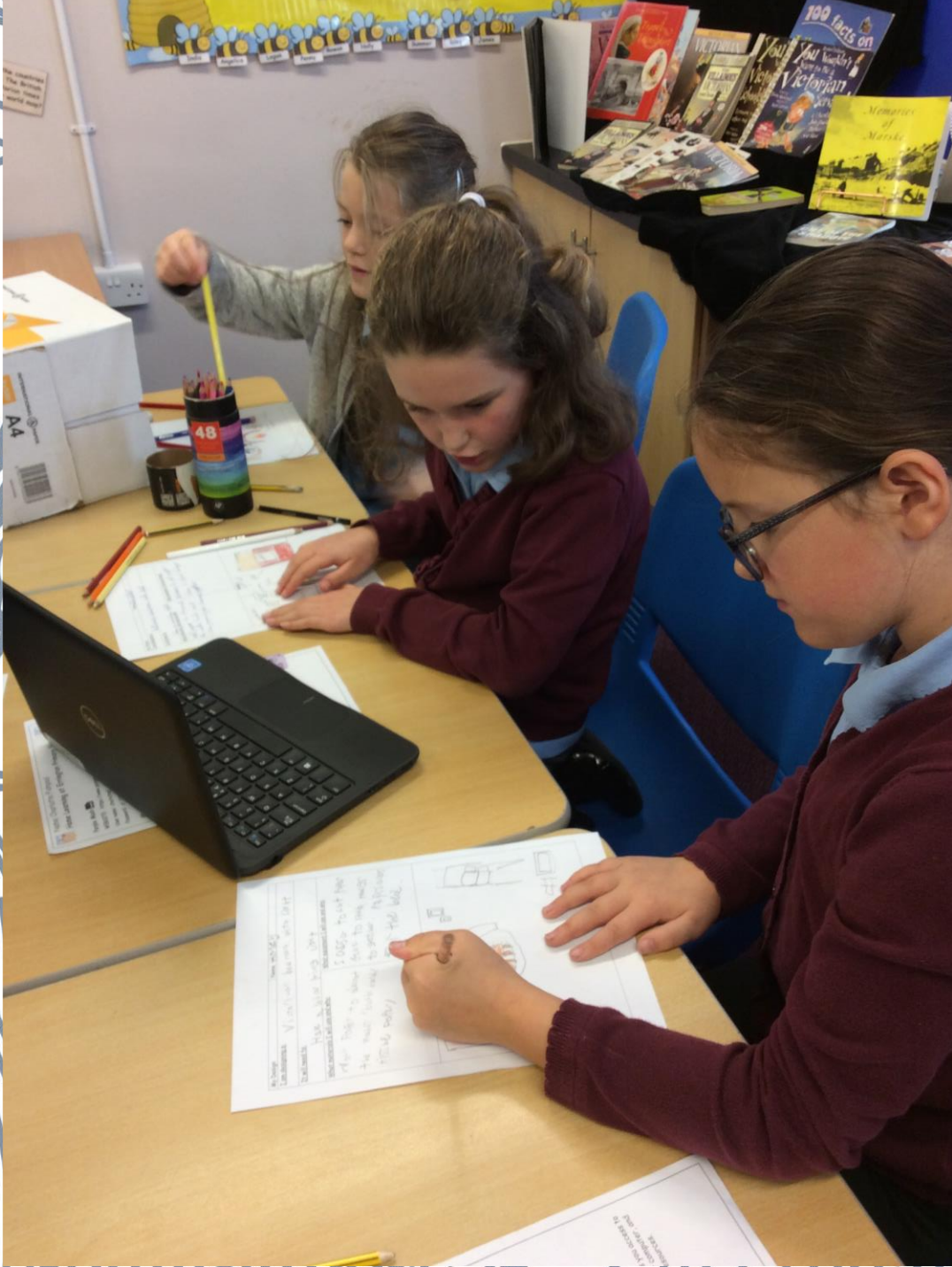
We'll use cardboard because it's sturdy. We need electricity because it needs to light up. We'll use fabric to make decor. Also, we'll use paper for extra details.

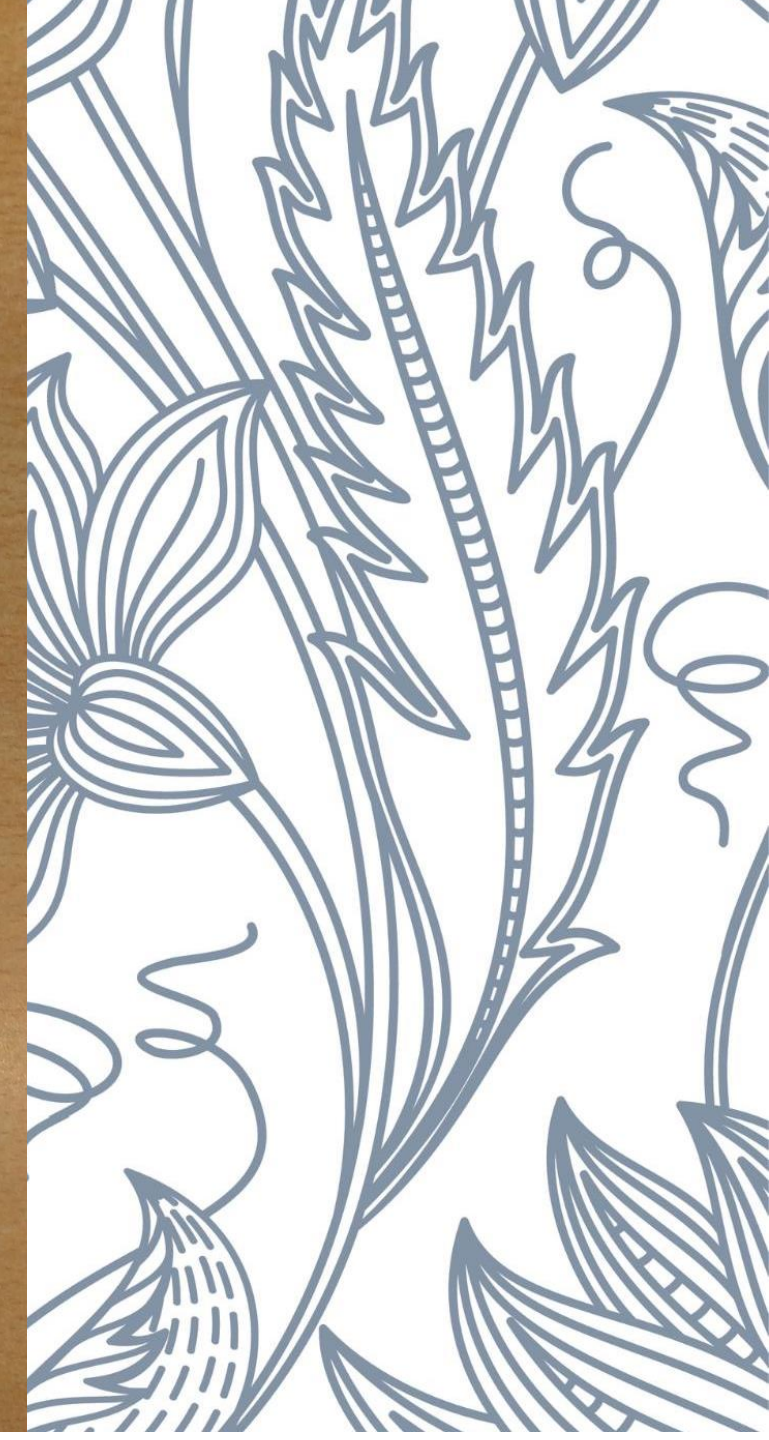
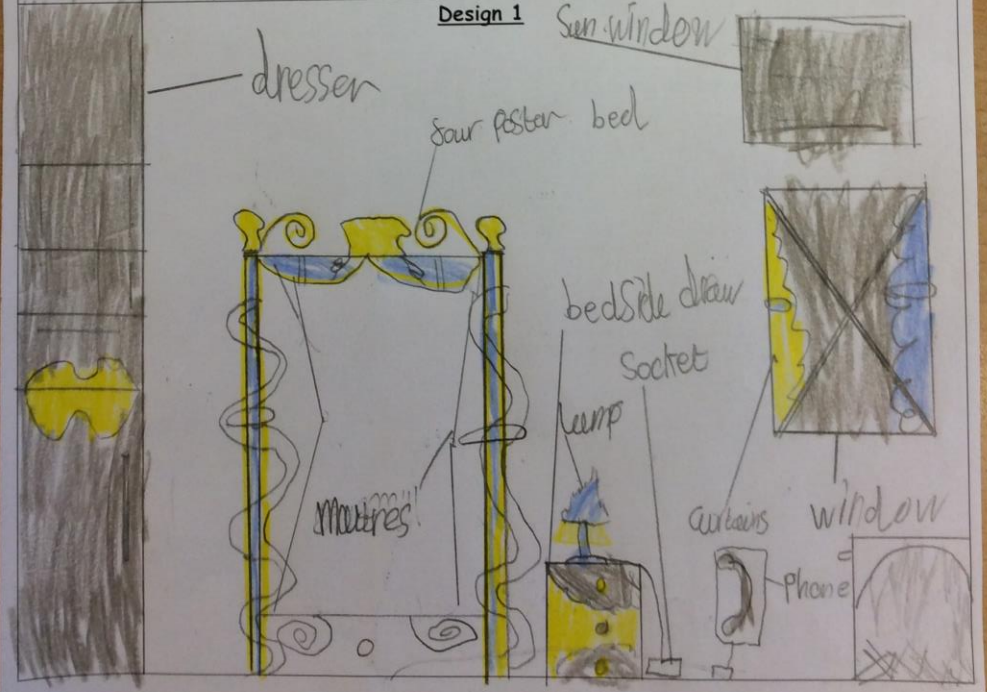
