Autumn 1 Overview.

This half term we will learn about what happens to our food as it goes through our bodies, in the exciting topic:



Burps, Bottoms and Bile

We will earn about the digestive system, from the role our teeth play to the way in which we get rid of our waste. We will become detectives to use the teeth of animals to determine their diets and then classify them in the sequence of food chains. We will explore the impact of the food trade on the world and how fair trade is having an impact on sustainability.

Topics and themes for the Enriched Curriculum:
