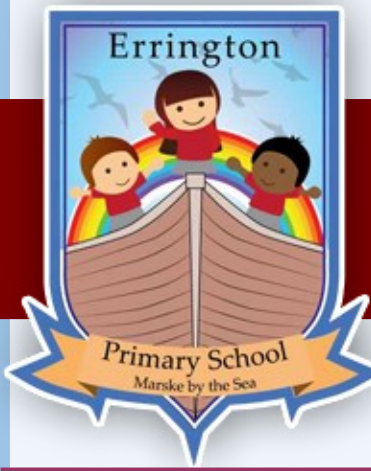

English:

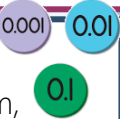
This half term we will be showing off our advertisement skills and persuading people to visit Mexico, using all the language, grammar and punctuation techniques developed over the year so far.

Maths:

Firstly fractions are our port of call this half term, adding and subtracting them before re-visiting fractions of amounts.

Then, decimals and how they fit into the place values that we have learnt about so far. Tenths, hundredths, multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100 and using our practical resources to move between them all.



Topics and themes for the Enriched Curriculum:

So, what is it like to live in Mexico? What are the customs? Who are the people, what makes them tick and the economies / communities thrive? We will emerge ourselves in the lives of the people living in Mexico now, influences from their past and how it is developing towards the future.

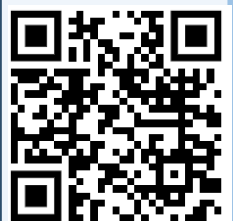
