Phonics

Phonics is a way of teaching children the skills to be able to read quickly and skilfully. Develop their confidence and love of reading. They are taught how to:

What is phonics?


- Recognise the sounds that each individual letter makes.
- Identify the sounds that different combinations of letters make - such as 'sh' or 'oo'/
 - Blend sounds together from left to right to make a word.
- Children can then use this knowledge to 'de-code' and segment new or trickier words that they hear or see.
- Children will learn to oral blend first a wonderful way to practice anywhere!

DEA:

Phonics

- In Reception, Phonics is taught daily. Initially this is as a whole class whilst the children learn their Set 1 sounds.
- Once the children have been assessed at the latter end of Autumn Term 1, they will be put into small groups based on ability.
- Children will learn how to match each letter to the sound it makes, as well as write the correct letter to match the sound.
- Sounds are taught in the purest form 'mmm' not 'meh' for 'm'.
- Children will learn to 'blend' (push the sounds together) to read words.
- Children will learn to read independently and develop skills to talk about what they have read.
- They will learn to segment the sounds and write words e.g. c-a-t for cat.




Key Information

- Phonics is **not** taught in alphabetic order.
- As the children become more confident in matching letters (graphemes) to sounds (phonemes), they will begin to learn more complex sounds.


Complex Sounds

- Special Friends: Two letters that make one sound.
 E.g. sh/ ch / qu / th.
- Split Sounds: Two vowels with a consonant between. The vowels make one sound. E.g. a-e and u-e (make and huge).
- Alternative sounds: A sound that can be made from a combination of different letters. Eg a / ay / ai / a-e.



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Reading at Home

Working together in a partnership!

In Reception, books for pleasure will be sent home at first. Books for pleasure will come home on a **Monday** and **Friday**. Please ensure that the books are returned for these days. Your child will need their bookbag.

We kindly ask that you read the reading for pleasure books 3 times a week. At this stage we do not expect Reception children to read. We would love it if you could spend quality time reading with your child. This will support a love of reading!

Once children have been assessed and put into phonic groups, and / or have reached the appropriate level, a book levelled to their phonics ability will also come home on a Monday and Friday. You will be informed of this and further support with reading phonic books at home can be provided.

Phonics Levelled Books

- Once your child has built a bank of sounds and is beginning to blend (push the sounds together to make the word) independently they will move onto other simple books that they can read independently. These books have CVC words in and some high frequency or 'red' words. These are tricky words such as I, the and was, that the children will have to learn by sight.
- At this stage the children will begin to bring phonics books home, these books will have been read for the week in phonics. Children will be more fluent at these stories and able to talk about the stories.
